Scientific Events

The scientific events included three plenary presentations: i) Aflatoxin Biocontrol: First Arizona, then the World, ii) Diagnostics for newly pathogens affecting emerging ornamental nurseries and landscapes in the Caribbean: potential threats for the U.S., and iii) Caribbean pathways for invasive pathogens: perspectives and actions from Puerto Rico.

The meeting also included three symposia, i) Emergent Pathogens-Liberibacter species, ii) Grape and Tree and Nut Diseases, and iii) Tropical Plant Diseases: Etiology, Spread, and Management; and 20 oral presentations and 15 posters. Collectively, more than 50 presentations were made during these events.

Words from Themis Michailides



Graduate Student Oral Competition Awards and Travel Awards





Three students were selected as winners of the Student Paper Competition. The first place winner (\$500) was **Nicholas Garber**, University of Arizona (mentor **Dr. Peter Cotty**), who presented on "Host colonization affects community composition of aflatoxin-producing fungi in the Rio Grande Valley of Texas." The second place winner (\$300) was **Lydia Tymon**, Washington State University (mentor **Dr. Dennis Johnson**), who spoke on "Fungicide resistance of two Alternaria species to azoxystrobin and boscalid in the Columbia Basin." **Soumyadip Kundu**, NM State University (mentor **Dr. Soum Sanogo**) was the third place winner (\$200), and presented on "Peduncular and seed infection in chile pepper by the plant pathogenic fungus *Verticillium dahliae*."

Recipients of Travel Awards included Lydia Tymon from Washington State University, Soumyadip Kundu from New Mexico State University, and Diego Viteri from University of Idaho.
