EARLY CAREER ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The award is presented annually by the Northeast Division of APS to recognize an early-career scientist who has made a significant contribution in plant pathology. The notable contribution may be in the area of research, teaching, extension, or service. NED-APS members in academia, industry, government, or private practice are eligible for this award if they are within 10 years of receiving their last academic degree.

Documentation for the award should include 1) a brief curriculum vitae, and 2) a one-page nomination statement detailing the noteworthy achievement and its impact on plant pathology.

Examples of significant achievements might be: a series of refereed publications addressing a specific research area; developing and/or teaching a course that significantly enhances students' educational experience; a series of extension publications that permit clients to avoid and/or resolve specific disease problems; significant contributions to NED-APS and/or APS as an officer, editor, etc. Publications relating to the contribution should be noted on a separate page. Members of NED-APS may nominate one candidate for the award and should sign the nomination document.

The award consists of an engraved plaque and \$100. The NED-APS awards committee will be responsible for selecting the awardee.
