## GENERAL PUBLICATION POLICIES

At least one author must be a member of The American Phytopathological Society, except that any subscribing institution outside the United States or Canada may have published, by a staff member, one paper (in English) per volume. A letter of transmittal, signed by an official of the foreign institution, should accompany such manuscripts.

**Submission of manuscripts:** Submit all new manuscripts to The American Phytopathological Society, Editorial Office, 3340 Pilot Knob Road, St. Paul, Minnesota 55121. Do not submit new manuscripts to the Editor-in-Chief. Submission implies nonsubmission elsewhere and (if accepted) no publication elsewhere in the same form without consent.

**Content:** Contributions should fall into the following categories: 1) Original research on some aspect of plant pathology or brief accounts of techniques or phytopathological history of general importance. Subject matter is not a criterion for judging the merit of an article for publication in *Phytopathology*. It is, however, the author's duty to establish relevancy to the science of plant pathology. 2) Review papers developing a new concept, hypothesis, theory, or other integration of plant pathology. 3) Letters to the Editor: These may explain, amplify, or otherwise comment upon research published in the journal or elsewhere. Letters to the editor are reviewed in the same manner as regular contributions, and the Editorial Board reserves the right to reject, or to publish, letters of rebuttal when appropriate. If possible, the opportunity will be provided for a letter of rebuttal to appear in the same issue as the letter to which it is directed.

**Contributions:** The high costs of publishing articles in *Phytopathology* requires that we solicit from research sponsors voluntary contributions in the amount of \$25 per printed page. Payment of the suggested contribution is not a condition of publication. Articles are accepted or rejected only on the basis of scientific merit. We ask that you advise your institution, company, or research sponsor of our need for contributions in support of publication costs. In the event that your research sponsor declines to make the suggested contribution, provide a letter to that effect from your administrative officer when you submit your manuscript.

**Separates:** No free copies supplied. Reprints will be available at a nominal cost; quotation will be sent with proof.

**For style details, follow:** Author's Guide for Manuscript Preparation, *Phytopathology* 67:5-8, 1977, and CBE Style Manual (third edition, 1972), available from Amer. Inst. Biol. Sci., Washington, D.C. Authors are urged to have one or more colleagues read the manuscript *critically* prior to submission.

**Use of material from this journal:** *Phytopathology* is copyrighted, and those who wish to borrow illustrations or data appearing in *Phytopathology* for use in other publications should obtain the permission of the author of the paper and of the Editor-in-Chief, and provide a line crediting *Phytopathology* as the source of the material.
